

RED BALL TRAP ASSEMBLY AND USE

Components:

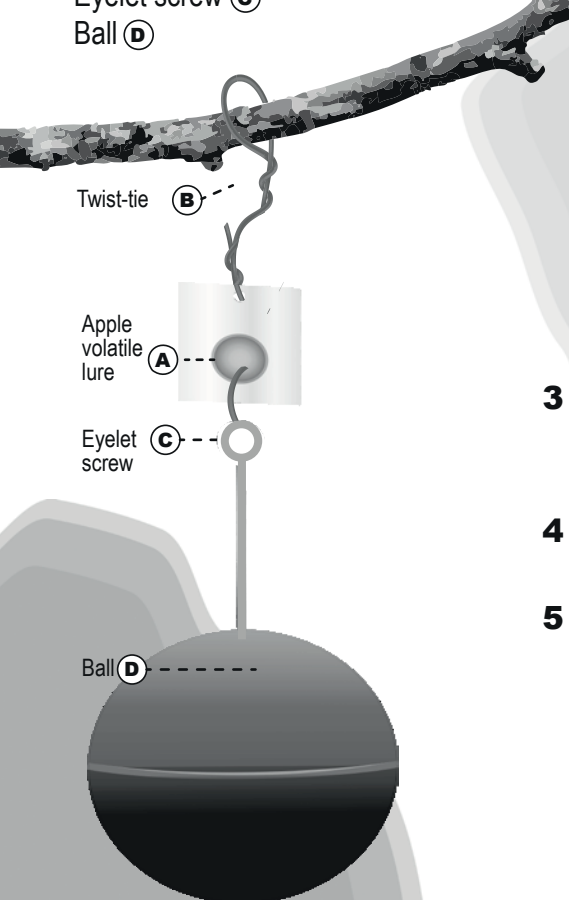
Apple volatile lure (A)

(sold separately,
Product No. 40CT217)

Twist-tie (B)

Eyelet screw (C)

Ball (D)



Trap Assembly

- 1 Snap two halves of the red ball together. Screw eyelet into top of trap. Loop twist-tie hanger through eyelet.
- 2 If using apple volatile lure to increase trap efficacy, remove bubble cap from sealed pouch (**do not puncture bubble cap**: attractant will disperse through the plastic) and loop the same twist tie through the hole in the top of the attractant strip so it is just beneath the limb.
Use one lure per 3 traps
Apply trap coating (not included) directly to red ball or, alternatively, wrap ball with transparent stretch film and apply trap coating on top.
- 3 Clean out foliage and other fruit for at least 30 cm (12 in.) to the sides and top of trap so it is readily visible.
- 4 Clean and reapply insect trap coating as needed.
- 5 Ball traps can be cleaned with white spirit (mineral spirits) at the end of the season and stored for reuse. Unused attractants can be stored in a sealed bag in the freezer.

For backyard trees, place 1-2 traps per dwarf trees, 2-4 traps per medium size trees, and 4-8 traps for very large trees. In commercial blocks, place 6-12 traps per acre on the perimeter row



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
